Weekly Letter Focus: I i Go on a letter hunt! Find 5 things in your home that begin with the letter I i Draw and label them.	Go on a shape hunt! Look for an item shaped like a square, rectangle, and circle in your house. Challenge: see if you can find a tricky shape like a triangle or hexagon!	Have a picnic. Help your adult to prepare a healthy snack or a meal and take it outside to eat. Talk about what you see and hear.	Take a virtual field trip to a recycling centre. Practice printing the letter I i Use the practice sheet, a piece of paper, print with a stick in the dirt or any other way your parent says is okay.	Learn how to play the card game Garbage. This practices number recognition, numerical order, ten frames concepts. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=an75_I0ZNZI	Be aware of all five of your senses. Notice: 5 things you can see 4 things you can hear 3 things you can feel 2 things you can smell 1 thing you can taste.	Dig in the dirt where your grown ups say it is okay. Did you see any worms. What do they look like? What do they feel like. Worms are recycling superheroes. Come to the Zoom meeting to learn more!
Journal how you can help planet Earth. Sound out the words and print the letters that you hear. Send your teacher a photo of your picture.	Count all the light switches in your house. Challenge: take a paper and pencil with you and make tally marks for each switch. Remember the fifth tally mark goes across the bundle.	Help clean up our planet! Go for a walk with an adult. Take gloves and a bag. Pick up some trash if you see it lying around. Make sure to ask your adult if it is safe to pick up first.	Go for a walk with your family. Find a tree and give it a big hug. Why do we need trees? What do trees give us? Discuss this with your family.
Watch a video of Mrs. Robison telling a story. Retell the story to someone in your family. Who were the characters? Where did the story take place? What happened?	Print numbers 1 - 20 on sticky notes or little pieces of paper. Ask a grown up or older sibling to hide the numbers in your house. Go on a number hunt.	Fill a bucket! Make a card or write a letter to someone in your neighbourhood or someone that lives alone. Have an adult help you deliver it safely.	Create something with recyclables. Use whatever craft supplies you have and use your imagination. Send a picture of your creation to Mrs. Robison.
