I want to start by thanking you all for supporting your child's learning. I have been learning how to use 'zoom' and I am hoping to set up a trial 'meeting' tomorrow at 10:30. I will set it up and send you an invitation later this afternoon. I really miss seeing those little faces :). I am hoping that we can set up a weekly check in at a regular time. Hopefully this will give the children a little motivation.

Some of you have shared with me that you are choosing your own learning activities at home (life skills- baking, building, work books, and other activities.) This is fantastic! I appreciate the pictures and emails that I have been getting letting me know what the kids have been up to.

As always, I will suggest that the children do some of the weekly regulars:

- Math - one page per day (I have attached the weekly 'blurb' in case your child has finished the last chapter)
- Journal- 4 to 8 sentences. (I have attached a picture if you would like to write about what is happening in it :)
- Reading - 15 to 30 minutes per day

I am not going to send a 'Math Blurb' attachment this week as it is mostly review in Chapter 20. There is some 2 digit addition and subtraction questions as well. The children **must** remember to start at the ones place with these questions. Next chapter(21) we start with regrouping. I will go over this with them during next week's zoom meeting. I have also found some math games that are explained in youtube videos that the kids might want to play.

We would be studying the life cycles of frogs at this time if we were in school. I have attached some life cycle activities and a 'Wild Kratts ' frog video to watch if you like.

Mr. Lassche and Mr. Lee have put together so activities as well and have posted them on their links on the 'Tansor school virtual class room' site.
