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| <p>Weekly Letter Focus: J j Go on a letter hunt! Find 5 things in your home that begin with the letter J j Draw and label them.</p> | <p>Play the dice game attached to the email. If you don't have dice at home try this virtual dice tool: https://www.didax.com/math/virtual-manipulatives.html</p> | <p>Tell your mom you love her and do something special for her on Mother's day. What can you make for her or do for her to show you care?</p> | <p>Find something that could be a treasure. Hide it and make a map to show where your treasure is hidden. Ask someone in your family to use the map to go on a treasure hunt!</p> |
| <p>Practice printing the letter J j. Use the practice sheet, a piece of paper, print with a stick in the dirt or any other way your parent says is okay.</p> | <p>Cut off 2 parts of an egg carton so there are 10 cups. Gather 10 small items/counters. Fill some of the spots. How many spaces are full? How many are empty? Continue to explore friendly numbers that make 10 (ex. 6 and 4).</p> | <p>Listen to this Jack Hartmann song about what plants need. Do plants have the same needs as we do? How are plants and animals needs the same and different? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DPL0F2V9_gY</p> | <p>Do a science experiment to see how plants absorb water. Put a light coloured flower or a piece of celery into a jar of water with food colouring. Check it each day, what do you notice happening?</p> |
| <p>Journal about some of the plants you see growing at your house. Sound out the words to label the plants in your picture.</p> | <p>Go on a number hunt around your house. Where can you find numbers (oven, clock, measuring cups)? Write down all the numbers you can find.</p> | <p>Make a poster to help remind everyone in your family to wash their hands. A good poster has words and pictures.</p> | <p>With a balloon or beanbag or soft object try to keep it in the air by catching it and throwing it into the air.</p> |
| <p>Help your parent write a grocery list. Copy words from food packages. What kinds of food on the list come from plants? Underline the foods that come from plants.</p> | <p>Take a poll. Come up with a question (i.e. what is your favourite colour). Ask your family members (maybe make some phone calls to ask others). Record people's answers. Discuss the results.</p> | <p>Follow PE Joe for some Daily exercise: https://tinyurl.com/y7yb9fzw</p> | <p>Pick some flowers and use it to inspire some art. Draw or paint the flowers you picked. Send Mrs. Robison a picture of your masterpiece!</p> |
