

K-3 FINE ARTS: WEEK OF MAY 18 - 22
THREE DIMENSIONAL ART


You will need 2 sizes of paper:
a white paper 8 and 1/2 by 11
a double wide sheet 11 x 18 inches

pastels
watercolour paints
markers
a piece of charcoal
a sharpie

a paper napkin
a plastic spoon to glue down
glue gun
glue stick

Step 1:

1. Find 2 circle shapes around the house to trace: an ice cream pail lid; a plate a little bit smaller than the lid.



2. Take a sheet of paper and trace the smaller circle on it. Use oil pastels to trace the letters of the alphabet into it. Press hard. Draw some of the letters upside down, some going sideways. use different colours.

3. Draw tiny orange squares for carrots, and little green circles for peas.

4. Then, paint over the letters with yellow-orange watercolour to create an oil pastel resist.



Step 2:

1. Trace out the 2nd circle (the larger ice cream pail lid) onto a larger sheet a little off to the side.
2. Draw out vertical and horizontal lines on the sheet using a marker colour. Do not trace the lines onto the circle. In the example, pink lines were drawn.
3. Gently, paint water over the lines to make a “paint-y” look.

Step 3

1. Cut out your soup circle. Glue it in the centre of the larger circle, using a glue stick.



2. Glue down your napkin next to the bowl. You can pre-cut your napkin to trim it to size. Smudge an L-shape to one side of the napkin with a charcoal.
3. Glue down your plastic spoon using the glue gun.

LEARNING GOALS:

-Students can identify letters and draw them in their artwork going in different directions

-Students can define mixed media and create artwork using a variety of media

-Students can define and create horizontal and vertical lines

-Students can define three-dimensional

The focus of this lesson combines letter formation/identification with an understanding of mixed media (we used oil pastels, liquid watercolor paint, markers and charcoal), and three-dimensional elements within artwork.
