<p>Journal: Imagine you found a dinosaur egg! What would you do? Sound out the words and print the letters that you hear. Send your teacher a photo of your picture.</p>	<p>Word Problem: A dinosaur caught 5 fish for dinner. But 1 of the fish got away. How many fish did the dinosaur have left to eat? Try using this word problem worksheet or show your thinking in a different way.</p>	<p>Melvin the Monkey has been feeling scared about the virus. What are some fears that you have? Talk about your fears with your family. What does your body feel like when you are scared? Who and what can help you when you are feeling scared? Practice taking some Monkey Breaths as this can help us feel calm. Palmer made Melvin a face mask to help him feel safer about the virus. What makes you feel safe?</p>	<p>Dinosaurs lived in a land covered with giant ferns. We still have ferns in our world today though most of them aren't giant! Can you find ferns in your yard or neighbourhood? Look closely at them and see how they are different from other plants. Try making some art by printing making with fern fronds!</p>
<p>Practice printing the letter Y Use the practice sheet, a piece of paper, print with a stick in the dirt or any other way your parent says is okay.</p>	<p>** Counting on a number line. Can you hop the dinosaur along the number line to answer the addition sentences?</p>		
<p>Read this emergent reader about dinosaurs with your family: Dinosaurs</p>	<p>Do you have toy dinosaurs at your house? Sort them! How can you sort them in different ways? Sort them by colour, by size, by meat eater/plant eater, etc.</p>		<p>Try making some Dinosaur Dough. Use toy dinosaurs to make impressions (fossils), footprints, or add rocks and plants to make a dino small world play.</p>
